General Outcome 1

Students will listen, speak, read, write, view and represent to explore thoughts, ideas, feelings and experiences.

Express ideas and develop understanding

Consider the ideas of others

General Outcome 2

Students will listen, speak, read, write, view and represent to comprehend and respond personally and critically to oral, print and other media texts.

Use prior knowledge

- use knowledge of print, pictures, book covers and title pages to construct and confirm meaning

Experience various texts

- participate in shared listening, reading and

viewing experiences, using oral, print and other media texts from a variety of cultural traditions and genres, such as poems, storytelling by elders, pattern books, audiotapes, stories and cartoons

Construct meaning from texts

- relate aspects of stories and characters to personal feelings and experiences
- tell, represent or write about experiences similar or related to those in oral, print and other media texts

Understand techniques and elements

- tell what characters do or what happens to them in a variety of oral, print and other media texts

General Outcome 3

Students will listen, speak, read, write, view and represent to manage ideas and information.

Focus attention

- explore and share own ideas on topics of discussion and study

Determine information needs

- ask and answer questions to satisfy information needs on a specific topic

Share ideas and information

- answer questions directly related to texts
